



- Please, no fireworks in NWACA July 4th it's a real fire hazard for our green spaces and our homes


Our Committees at Work - 3

- 4th of July Parade
 - Gathering volunteers come see us at the table!
- Transportation
 - Unveiled new traffic awareness signs last month
 - Can pick up one at the table tonight
- Parks
 - Focused on Allen Park, with strong local team in charge
- Tree and Environmental Stewardship
 - Annual Do Not Prune campaign underway now
 - Assisting neighbors with current oak wilt breakout

- 2 hazardous waste collections and 2 gardening events May 8, 2013 NWACA

Oak Wilt Prevention is Key

- <u>Do not Prune</u> oaks Feb thru June
- Plan Ahead establish a 5-year arbor plan
 - Nov-Jan dormant growth season is ideal
 - Oaks need pruning only every 3-5 years
- Reject doorbell ringers use certified arborists
- Minimize stress on trees
 - Keep root zone mulched or irrigated
 - Remove competing invasive plants and trees
 - If pruning damaged limbs now, paint cuts *immediately*



- NWACA = Northwest Hills, Highland Hills, and some others
- Northwest Hills includes: Shinoak Valley, Cat Mountain, Cat Mountain Villas, Lakewood Village, Lakewood Park, Meadow Mountain, North Cat Mountain, Parkhill, and Vista West.



Timeline for Northwest Hills

- Before 1950 sparsely inhabited, gravel pit (with landing strip!) in midst of open land
- 1950-1957 initial subdivisions created
 - Highland Hills (Bradfield and Brush)
 - Dry Creek Drive and Mountainclimb Drive area (The Austin Corporation)
- 1980's Shinoak Valley last subdivision built
- Today just a few small plots of developable land to define and design

- Both worked for others, served in the military
- By 1961, both David and Chuck were working with David's father (known as "Mr. Barrow")





10-1 – What's Happening for NWACA

Preserving NWACA for the Future

- Wildfires are a clear and present danger, and NWACA is in a very vulnerable greenbelt
- Wildfire prevention is being organized
 - NWACA Committee to coordinate over whole area, with a Yahoo Group, anyone can join to share ideas
 - Large neighborhood areas work together
 - Meadow Mountain area since 2004
 - Lakewood area in progress for several years
 - Greater Valburn Firewise Alliance just starting (next slide)
 - Individual streets, cul-de-sacs harden their homes to be Firewise Communities, each group with a "Fireplug" coordinating for the larger neighborhood area

Example: Greater Valburn Area



- 8 "fireplugs"
 identified
 thus far
- 2 have held neighbor education meetings and are ready to move to next step
- Alliance to meet next week
