The permit has been approved. There is a meeting Friday with a representative from Doss elementary about logistics and set up for the freedom festival. A message will be put on all the neighborhood school marquees announcing the event.

The T-shirt design was approved and the same number that we had in 2019 will be ordered. Keating will bundle the orders when they arrive. Rawlings, Statz, Connett, and Keating will set up times for T-shirt pick up.

Port-a-potty and barricades are required and will be ordered.

Tony Plohetski will be the Parade Master of Ceremony. Anderson Highschool marching band will play and inquiries are being made for someone to sing the national anthem.

Floats - Grayum will manage the float contest including sign ups, finding judges, prizes, and day of line up. Judges historically are school principals or business members.

Other needs include ordering trash cans, decorating the Doss fence, ordering Yard Cards to promote the event, gathering tables and chairs, getting a head count of board members that are planning to walk in the parade, and inviting local officials. Chris Currents will maintain a spreadsheet of needs and notify us when he is ready for volunteers on specific items for July 4th.
