

Our Focus: Wildfire Mitigation



Home Ignition Zone -home and surrounding 100-foot area



Zone 1 - Immediate Zone: 0 to 5 feet from home

Zone 2 - Intermediate Zone: 5 to 30 feet from home

Zone 3 - Extended Zone: 30 to 100 feet from home

For Central Texas, though, this graphic needs oak trees in the yard and near the house for shade! And, they're good!

 - Recycling bins at local parks; bike repair stations at local elementary schools; portions of Anderson High band trailer, Murchison Community Gardens, …


NWACA Communications


Survey Results – Areas for NWACA Board to Work on

Marc Duchen– D10 Councilmember





- Elected November 2024
- We suggested he address
 - Wildfire concerns
 - City Council response
 - Land Development Code
 - Latest changes
 - Council plans, upcoming items
 - Other items he considers key

Chief Carrie Stewart, AFD Wildfire Division





- AFD Wildfire Division
 - 23 years at AFD
 - Chief of the Wildfire Division
 - Has worked in active wildfires and has trained many fire fighters to do their work
- We asked her to focus on lessons learned about hardening our homes

Craig Brooks, Austin Energy





- Electric System Field Operations Director of Support Services
- 26 years experience in electric utility business at all levels
- Deep experience responding to disasters, including hurricanes Katrina, Ike, and Harvey
- We asked him to address:
 - What is being done in support of wildfire mitigation?
 - How is Austin Energy property being managed for wildfire?

Justin Bates, Austin Water





- Division Manager, Wildland Conservation (30 people)
- Oversees lands from Cedar Park to Hays County
- Previously with National Park Service, Supt. for LBJ National Historical Park and Waco Mammoth National Monument
- We asked him talk about wildfire mitigation by Austin Water

Matt McCaw, Austin Parks and Recreation





• We asked him to address:

- Handling wildfire fuel on PARD property (more than 12,500 acres of land)
 - General land management plans
 - Recent contracts for fuels mitigation what those will do
 - How can residents collaborate when their property is next to PARD property? Can we help remove fuel from PARD property?

- Parking in Bike Lanes now subject to fines
 - Parking in bike lanes after June 1 can result in a fine: early payment fine of \$50 or a \$75 standard fine
 - Commercial vehicle loading or unloading in a bike lane could result in a \$150 early payment fine and a \$300 standard fine
